Berlin Center for Torture Victims (bzfo) says "Thank you" to all donors

Donation project Berlinale and bzfo raised more than 25.000 Euros 66th Berlinale engaged for traumatized refugees in Berlin

Berlin, February 24, 2016 – Berlinale 2016 has been focusing on refugees – with giving the main prize "Goldener Bär" to the Italian documentary film *Fuocoammare* and with its donation appeal for traumatized refugees together with the bzfo. With the motto "Berlinale helps" the film festival spread donation leaflets, set up donation boxes and collected via betterplace.org, a platform for social projects (berlinale-for-

Many visitors responded to the appeal to this day the donations add up to 25.560,31 EUR. The bzfo will use the donations for fields of work, which are financed only partially or not at all by health insurances, social welfare offices, or other institutions.

Since 1992 the **bzfo** offers medical and psychotherapeutic treatment as well as social assistance for torture survivors and victims of war/ civil war conflicts who suffer from severe physical and psychological injuries. In 2015 more than 600 adults, children and youth have benefited from our support. They come from Syria, Afghanistan, Chechnya, Turkey, Iran, Iraq, Somalia, Kosovo, Lebanon, Eritrea and more than 50 other countries of origin.

In 2013 the bzfo started a special interdisciplinary program for newly arrived refugees in need of basic medical and psychosocial support as well as counseling. The bzfo is financed by the Federal Ministry for Family Affairs, Senior Citizens, Women and Youth, the United Nations, the EU, funds from the public healthcare system and by sponsors and numerous private donors.

Under the umbrella brand **Center UEBERLEBEN** the bzfo, the Center for Migration and Refugee Services, the Ueberleben Foundation for Victims of Torture and the non-profit organization Catania cooperate closely to give refugees, migrants and victims of violence the chance to have a dignified future. The Center offers a wide range of support from rehabilitation to social integration aimed at full participation in social, cultural and everyday life.
