The Center ÜBERLEBEN has been treating victims of torture and war-time violence. About 500 people from nearly 50 countries around the world come to us to find help.

At the Center, adults and children receive medical and psychotherapeutic treatment as well as support from social workers.

Our multidisciplinary team works with specially trained interpreters supporting therapy sessions and transmitting cultural background.

In order for our patients to learn to live with the consequences of torture and violence, often a long-term and intensive treatment is necessary.

We raise awareness through a number of specialist publications, through lectures and conferences, networking with national and international organizations and committees as well as through our active press and public relations work. Internationally, we are involved in developing and building treatment centers in areas of conflict and persecution.





Special library for documentation and research into specific consequences of torture, persecution and extreme traumatization



In our special library we document the physical and mental consequences of torture, persecution and extreme, traumatic experiences.

With more than 35,000 information carriers, it is a collection on this subject that is unique in Germany. In addition to books and magazine articles, the reference stock also includes conference contributions, annual reports, brochures, audio tape and film recordings. Additionally around 100 periodicals (electronic and print) are kept up to date.
